WHAT TO EXPECT

The Mission: Philanthropist.org allows socially minded investors to find Social Investments to invest in and directly sponsor Entrepreneurs in developing nations or your own neighborhood for as little as \$100. Realize entrepreneurship as long-term solution to poverty and help support those most eager to work. Philanthropist.org hosts several Workteering trips per year. These trips are designed to provide volunteer profilers the opportunity to work with aspiring entrepreneurs in developing nations and provide assistance to those who do not have access to technology solutions and global markets. Philanthropist.org believes these established entrepreneurs and small business owners are best equipped to help others by providing jobs and economic opportunities in their communities.

The Work: Each participant workteer is expected to locate and interview at least 10 entrepreneurs who match our profiling criteria. A profile questionnaire is expected to take 30-60 minutes and must include a high quality digital photo to be accepted. Participants must bring a laptop and digital camera. All tours and instruction is in English, but your interviews will be conducted with help of translators and facilitators. Spanish skills are a plus. Work may include profiling new people or following up on prior loans.



The Faculty: Philanthropist.org team members will lead the Profiling trip as well as a experienced Guest Lecturer. Bios will be available in advance. The trips are hands-on with minimum classroom time allocated. They are designed to be educational, with the Guest Lecturer providing local knowledge and instruction on his/her area of expertise.

Space is Limited

The Accommodations: Profiling trips often take us to impoverished areas of the world. As such, accommodations are sparse and basic. Standards are maintained to assure health and safety, but generally dormitory style sleeping is offered where participants may be sharing a room with one or more others. Hotels have bathroom facilities, running water, beds, and basic 1-to-2-star rated necessities.

The Costs: All inclusive profiling Field Study Trip is \$3700, or without airfare the cost is \$2700, however, no exceptions will be made to our itinerary. Scholarships are available to those who qualify. In addition to the cost of the trip, all profilers are responsible to purchase trip insurance and health insurance (\$300), however, this requirement will be waived if proof of valid recognized US Insurance card is provided which includes travel coverage in destination country. The profiling trip fee covers: Roundtrip Coach Airfare from Boston or NYC, Tuition/Reading/Profiling Materials, Room and Board (Most Meals), Transfers (at destination country), and Tours & Instruction from Guest Lecturer.

****All Inclusive trips originate in Boston (Logan International Airport) and include Roundtrip Airfare and all accommodations in the destination location. Individuals wishing to travel from other US-based cities or to travel from a International origination MAY be accepted, but must arrive before by check-in and depart after check-out to be accepted. Sorry NO EXCEPTIONS.**

The Application Process: While we encourage all to apply, we cannot accept all Profiler requests, both for space constraints and health and safety constraints. You can apply for sponsorship or submit your profile on our website. Profilers must:

1. Be 18 Years or Older
2. Hold High School Diploma (equivalent)
3. Be Fluent in English (Spanish is a plus!)
4. Possess Basic Computer Skills
5. Have Relevant College Coursework
6. Have a health Voucher
7. Have Health Insurance
8. Have International Travel Experience*

*Those without any International travel experience are not excluded from participation, however, you are required to write a 2000 word essay describing your interest, and applicable travel experiences, and the application will be carefully screened with a phone interview.

TRIP INFORMATION

SAFETY

Safety is our #1 priority. You are going to an underdeveloped area where people are struggling for basic necessities. You should wear OLD clothing, ripped t-shirts, shorts, etc. This is not a fashion show. No jewelry, no watches, no electronics, no designer sunglasses. While we hire paid "protection" for the trips where needed, and hotel partners are gated and locked, you should stay alert to your surroundings, much like any urban settings in the USA.

ACCOMMODATIONS

Hotels used will vary per trip and destination. We aim to stay at the best the region has the offer in a 1 hour minivan radius, usually a 2-3 star hotel. Both for safety and logistical reasons, the exact hotel location and meeting spot will not be provided prior to reservation. You will receive a detailed itinerary. To set expectations, budget Rooms in Beach Resorts such as: <http://www.hotelescolibri.com> are offered at \$25 USD per night, our target price is \$50/night. Typically accommodations are very nice by US standards, daily maid service, room service, safebox, etc. However, workerteers are reminded that the accommodations are safe and clean, but the field study tour is designed to reach as many people as possible OUTSIDE the typical tourist areas that cater to resort travelers. Hotel selected will have a website URL and this will be communicated prior to departure with a list of amenities, as an Island Nation, most hotels in the Dominican Republic are likely to be near the coast and beach.

TRANSPORTATION

A minivan is used for airport transfers, profiling trips, and excursions. Note that while the van seats 12, has air-conditioning, and is designed for travel on unpaved roads, travel is not designed for comfort. You will be travelling to areas that do not usually have paved roads and conditions are minimalistic. Bathroom breaks are taken as needed, but accommodations are minimal.

LUGGAGE

We fly JetBlue exclusively. Please see jetblue.com for details on your flight. Carry-On Allowance: 1 Bag + 1 Personal Item. JetBlue recently added a \$20 fee for a second checked bag. Maximum Dimensions of Checked Luggage: 62 linear inches/157 cm (length + width + height). Maximum Dimensions of Carry-on Luggage: 24in x 16in x 10in (length x width x height). your

bags, or better yet, bring some small items for local children you are likely to meet.

Maximum Dimensions of Personal Item: 18in x 15in x 8in (length x width x height). Maximum Weight: 50 lb/23 kg. Overweight baggage is NOT be accepted on flights to/from the Dominican Republic. Do NOT assume you can pay extra for a large bag, but you can carry two (max) within size limits. Dominican Republic trips are limited to two checked bags per person - JetBlue has strict restriction for (only) this country. GIVE & TAKE: You may wish to return with souvenirs...remember to leave space in your suitcase by bringing items you can leave behind.

PACKAGES EXCLUDE

Below is a partial-list of potential expenses you are likely to encounter on your tour. Please remember to purchase trip cancellation insurance. Some but not all meals are included, you should budget at least \$20 per day for items such as: Extra Baggage Fees, Tips & Gratuities, Bottled Water, Gifts, Souvenirs, Snacks, Fruits, Off-itinerary Transports, Entrance Fees, Taxes, Extra Local Guides/Translators, laundry, digital camera, batteries, clothing, toiletries, email/internet access, and mobile/telephone/fax charges. Be sure to bring currency, travelers checks, and a valid credit card.

TECHNOLOGY

While philanthropist.org is a technology firm and is working diligently to connect people in remote communities to the internet and a global marketplace via mobile phones and the latest technologies - the reality is that cell phone providers have yet to capitalize on the market opportunity in many rural areas. In the DR - only one carrier will work (well) with your GSM capable cell phone, Orange. SIM cards available here for under \$30: <http://www2.orange.co.uk/> A coverage map is available here: <http://www.gsmworld.com/>. See safety section. Ipods, large cameras, portable games, and other unnecessary items only attract problems of potential theft - please plan to leave your expensive electronics in your hotel room safe. Current Profiling Field Trips DO NOT require you to have mobile coverage on your phone, or that you bring a phone at all - we still do things the old fashion way with a pen and paper for basecamp laptop data entry; but we encourage you to bring your technology gizmos as we build toward real-time data interchanges. Digital Cameras with batteries are required, Laptops are
